### **Editorial**

Firstly, an update on the Main Project. We have been advised that the restoration work on the external fabric of the Hall should be completed by the end of October this year. There then follows a period of finishing the internal fitting out and landscaping around the Hall. The contractors expect this to be completed by the end of February next year.

#### The East Wall of the Walled Garden



Most of the top of the wall has now been removed (11 courses) and it became apparent as to why it was leaning when you could see the damage caused to it by Ivy. You can see the roots embedded in the brickwork and in sections of the wall they were down to a lower level. lvy is dreadful for finding its way through nooks and crannies and once in amongst the brickwork can cause deterioration to mortar and can also split bricks. Along with a contribution from our Group, thanks is due to the Heritage Lottery Fund as they have funded the majority of the cost of this work. Also our Volunteers have been helping the HTNW team in carrying out this work. Funds will have to be raised to rebuild this historic Wall.

## A New Entrance to the Walled Garden

Heritage Trust for the North West are currently considering a new entrance into the grounds for the public with a brick built entrance. This is an alternative to using the Potting Sheds but I would emphasize that the Potting Sheds are still a project and we continue to raise funds for it. The reason behind this is a re-think on how the Potting Sheds should be restored and used. Importantly the preservation of the historic wall on the north side of the walled garden has to be considered as this also appears to be have been heated and would have been built around the period 1790-1820. More information will follow as matters develop on these projects.

## **Interesting Find**

The contractors have very recently continued with the drainage work across the farm track and as they dug out for this they have kept an eye open for any artefacts. Not many were found but this picture shows part of a bottle which has been passed to us. This bottle is marked "Coca Mariani, Paris" and had it been complete would have been quite valuable. It contained a so-called medicine invented by Angelo Mariani in the 1860's, the recipe of which was the forerunner of Coca Cola. Just a pity the top has been broken off probably by the digger.
